

ALL SAINTS' DAY

The origin of the festival of All Saints celebrated in the West dates to May 13, 609 or 610, when Pope Boniface IV consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Blessed Virgin and all the Martyrs; the feast of the *dedicatio Sanctae Mariae ad Martyres* has been celebrated in Rome ever since. There is evidence that from the fifth through the seventh centuries there existed in certain places and at sporadic intervals a feast date May 13th to celebrate the holy martyrs. The origin of All Saints' Day cannot be traced with certainty, and it has been observed on various days in different places. However, there are some who maintain the belief that it has origins in the pagan observation of May 13th the feast of Lemures, in which the malevolent and restless spirits of the dead were propitiated. Liturgiologists base the idea that the *Lemuria* festival was the origin of that of All Saints in their identical dates and on the similar theme of "all the dead".

The feast day of All Saints, on its current date, is traced to the foundation by Pope Gregory III (731.741) of an oratory in St. Peter's for the relics "of the holy apostles and of all saints, martyrs and confessors, of all the just made perfect who are at rest throughout the world", with the day moved to November 1st and the May 13th feast suppressed.

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1st. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day which is observed on November 2nd. And is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven. Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day observances tend to focus on known saints — that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church.

Roman Catholic Obligation

In the Roman Catholic Church, All saints' Day is a Holy Day of obligation in many (but not all) countries, meaning going to Mass on the date is required unless one has a good reason to be excused from that obligation, such as illness. However, in a number of countries that do list All Saints' Day as a Holy Day of Obligation, including England & Wales, the solemnity of All Saints' Day is transferred to the adjacent Sunday if November 1st falls on a Monday or a Saturday, while in the same circumstances in the United states the Solemnity is still celebrated on November 1st but the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated.
